## Information

Beltram draws from the late 19th century German jobbing typefaces, namely the lighter weight of Akzidenz Grotesk in different sizes, as opposed to the infamous Halbfette. By concentrating on the expressive and irregular features and having moderate variance in horizontal proportions, Beltram aims to widen the gap towards the later, more rational neo-grotesques. Heavier weights are drawn without following corresponding historical models and stroke contrast is kept minimal across the whole range of styles. Beltram is spaced rather tight and meant for relatively large sizes.
